2022 YEAR END HIGHLIGHTS

With the closing of 2022, FMG is pleased to present some highlights and accomplishments achieved throughout the year.

- Published draft Environmental Assessment report for the proposed Springpole Gold Project for review and input.
- Held public open houses to present and discuss the draft environmental assessment in Sioux Lookout and Ear Falls.
- Completed another year of extensive environmental baseline data collection.

Published Inaugural First Mining Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) Report. FMG is proud to highlight our ESG metrics, including programs and initiatives that align with our strong environmental stewardship objectives, robust corporate governance practices and commitment to continuous improvement. Some key points from the 2021 report include:

- Highlighting diversity within First Mining Gold with Indigenous employment representing more than 20% of work force, and 50% of the site-based work force.
- As a founding member of the Sioux Lookout Mining Centre of Excellence, First Mining enabled 150 largely Indigenous youth to go through the basics of mine training to gain skills for potential jobs and leading to work placements. Goals and priority activities for 2022 presented for continued action and improvement.

Springpole Exploration Camp Improvements

Throughout 2021 and 2022, FMG's operations team installed two new accommodations buildings, and upgraded sewage and water treatment facilities at the Springpole exploration camp making it safer, more environmentally protective, and more comfortable for employees and guests. Some positive aspects of the upgrades include:

- Reduced GHG's and risk of fire from propane heating as we move out of the tents.
- Preparation and installment work was completed with zero injuries.
- Two accommodations buildings provide the ability to run one self contained camp during low peak periods and easily expand when numbers increase.
- Comfortable accommodations new modern rooms, kitchen and lounge spaces are larger, representing an investment in FMG employees and quests.

ENVIRONMENTAL BASELINE UPDATE

Caribou Study

Early in 2023, FMG conducted a caribou study in the area around the Springpole site. The study, required by the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks, involved an aerial survey by helicopter, followed by a caribou collaring program. The program resulted in 50 caribou being fitted with GPS satellite collars that are programmed to drop from the animals in 4 years. The objective of the study is to identify important seasonal habitat areas and how caribou use their homerange to support species conservation and mitigation strategies.





Wolverine Study

A wolverine study commenced around the Springpole site in February which involved the placement of 25 non-invasive hair snag and camera monitoring stations. The intent of the study is to develop an understanding of Wolverine use of the landscape relative to the proposed Springpole project. The stations involve erecting a run pole that is affixed to a sturdy tree. On the run pole there are two upright structures – the first holds 12 alligator clips intended to grab a small amount of fur, and release easily upon contact by wildlife passing through the frame. Fur samples collected are sent to a lab for genetic analysis. The second upright structure serves as a platform for the front legs of the target Wolverine to access the hanging bait. This orientation is intended to expose the underside of the Wolverine to be captured by the camera which will provide data for individual identification, classification, and reproductive status. The stations will be checked on a monthly basis to collect hair samples, refurbish cameras and to ensure the stations remain in a safe and functioning state prior to being decommissioned in May.
